- **Authoritative Metadata**
 - structured data
 - semi-structured data
 - natural language text
- **Non-authoritative Metadata**
 - User Tags (free keywords)
 - User Comments
 - controlled vocabulary
- **Media Analysis Metadata**
 - low level features
 - high level features

Jules Gabriel Verne (French: [ʒyl vɛʁn]; 8 February 1828 – 24 March 1905) was a French novelist, poet, and playwright best known for his adventure novels and his profound influence on the literary genre of science fiction. Born to bourgeois parents in the seaport of Nantes, Verne was trained to follow in his father's footsteps as a lawyer, but quit the profession early in life to write for magazines and the stage. His collaboration with the publisher Pierre-Jules Hetzel led to the creation of the Voyages Extraordinaires, a widely popular series of scrupulously researched adventure novels including *Journey to the Center of the Earth*, *Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea*, and *Around the World in Eighty Days*. Exploratory Search and Recommender Systems

- Fluent boundaries between **exploratory search** and (content-based) **recommendation**
- Both are depend on **ranking of facts**
 - *Which fact is more “important”?*
(1) Albert Einstein was a physicist.
or
(2) Albert Einstein was a vegetarian.
- The importance of a fact often depends on the given **context**
- **Knowledge graphs** in combination with **language models** and **logfile data** can be exploited to automatically learn **ranking heuristics**


